

MINUTE 1722

An Extraordinary Meeting of the Parish Council was held on Thursday the 3rd day of MARCH 2022 at the Royal British Legion, Long Lane, commencing 7.30 pm, to discuss a confidential matter with a resident.

COUNCILLORS PRESENT: Messrs Rayner (Chair), Cock, Cole and Fenn, Mrs Arnold, Mrs McGeeney and Mrs Peckham.

APOLOGIES FOR ABSENCE: Apologies were received from Mrs Bane, Mr Lambert, Mr Storey and Mrs Wilson.

DECLARATIONS OF INTEREST: There were no declarations of interest.

PUBLIC SPEAKING: There were no members of the public present.

Complaint - A letter had been received via email from resident following solicitor's letter delivered to him 10th February 2022 (see Minute 1721 Item 56). The letter was discussed at length and on the advice of Norfolk Police, Mrs Peckham proposed instructing the Crime Officer to undertake a Crime Prevention Survey of the playing field, setting up a meeting with the resident following receipt of the results to discuss any evidence that arises, writing to the resident informing him of this and that any anti-social behaviour should be reported to the Police in the meantime, and advising him that the Clerk only works 15 hours a week, Monday to Friday, and only until 4.00 pm, and will only respond to telephone calls or emails during these hours, Mrs McGeeney seconded, all in favour. Clerk to instruct Police to carry out a Crime Prevention Survey and write to resident.
